Disturbed by the moral decline of his times, he withdrew to live as a hermit near Subiaco, Italy, devoting himself to prayer and simplicity. His holiness attracted followers who desired a similar way of life as his vision emphasized humility, stewardship, and the understanding that all things – material and spiritual – are gifts to be used for God's glory. St. Benedict's life reflects Jesus' teaching in the Parable of the Rich Fool where true wealth lies not in possessions or success, but in a life rooted in God's presence and shared generously with others.
